These principles inform exclusions of mismatched tools:

- Colorful mobiles: Inappropriate as 1-week-olds have 20/400 acuity and prefer high-contrast; they risk overstimulation without aiding body awareness (Atkinson, 2000).

- Electronic soothers: Disrupt natural co-regulation; AAP guidelines note no electronics under 18 months, favoring human interaction for attachment (Bowlby, 1969).

Ranking prioritizes leverage for week 1's rapid adjustments—reflex calming, weight gain,

and alertness windows—over long-term utility. Tools emphasize practice via tactile input, with minimal theory. All are seasons-complete (indoor, weather-independent) and inclusive (non-gender-specific, educational for all via mentorship). Sustainability weighs cost, durability, and ease; the #1 is top-leverage but bulk-sourced, so a sustainable alternative is labeled.

strong leverage via organic cotton containment, more sustainable than #1 (standard retail, higher durability at 104 weeks, simpler sourcing at ~27 EUR).
